

*"The Salmon River Watershed:
Jewel of Eastern Ontario"*

This informative book describes the journey of the Salmon River from its headwaters southeast of Bon Echo Provincial Park to its mouth at Lake Ontario near Shannonville. Different facets of the watershed are explored in nine sections, including geography, physiography, geology, ecology, as well as the rich history and current status of settlement, giving an understanding of how watersheds are shaped, and the impact of human settlement. Integral relationships with land, water, flora and fauna of the watershed are celebrated through poems, prose and artworks, and the joys of exploring the river by canoe and kayak are described.

A valuable resource for all who want to know more about the Salmon River and its watershed, this book will also be a useful baseline for further studies. The text is illustrated with colour photographs, maps, graphs and artwork. The authors represent a wealth of expertise, knowledge and experience, and address their respective topics with distinct voices.
